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

akistan's ISI has been working on K2 for decades. ISI has established a strong base in Dubai to run their 'Bleed India' project.

Some Kashmiris are the kingpins of this project for the Valley. Among them are the Qureshi Brothers of Kachhama village in Kupwara, a frontier district of Kashmir. They are playing a very powerful role in ISI's Kashmir project, and are now based in Pakistan.

A large number of Sikhs are working in Gulf countries.

ISI has easy reach in Gulf. ISI shall definitely try to influence and indoctrinate the Sikhs working there to get involved in subversive activities in India.

Influence Of Anti-India Elements In Kashmir

This is a big risk factor for the government. It is to be noted that through nearly 40 years of separatism and terrorism, the Kashmiri Sikh never got involved in such subversive activities. In addition to the Kashmiri Pandits, the Sikhs also suffered terrible onslaughts like the Chittisinghpura massacre in which 35 members of the Sikh community were killed by the terrorists.

The Sikhs of Kashmir have never been anti-India. But ISI keeps working on its plan to break India. The government has to be very cautious. *Mazhab ke naam par ISI kisi Kashmiri Sikh youth to influence karne ki koshish zaroor karega.*

Among Muslims, we still have a strong separatist and radicalized constituency in Kashmir. When any man stands up against centre, he starts getting support among a section of the Kashmiris. This is a fault-line in Kashmir that has been nurtured by Pakistan for more than 40 years.

If the radical sections of the Kashmiris see an anti-India figure in a state as close as Punjab, they start feeling emboldened. Koi bhi Centre to aankhen dikhata hai – ye khush ho jaate hai. Radicalized youth become vocal on social media in their support for an anti-India figure.

But sympathy towards a wrong figure has always led to wrong consequences. There are strong signals that ISI plans to create trouble in Punjab and Kashmir. The radicalized youth are a readymade fertile ground.

Why Amritpal Has Been Able To Garner Local Support In Punjab

For many years now, I have been a regular visitor to Amritsar for work-related projects. Over the last couple of months, I was watching the Amritpal phenomenon. From the beginning, it was clear that this Sikh separatist is an ISI template that we are watching all over again. Only the face is new and the name is different.

But the fact remains that ISI can only plant a person to do their divisive, communal and polarizing talk. So what is the reason for Amritpal Singh's popularity at the grassroots level? This is the question that intrigued me.

To answer this question, I met people in various villages of Amritsar and spoke to them about this new drama that we are watching called Amritpal Singh. I asked them the reasons for his popularity. Amritpal hails from Jallupur Khaira village in Amritsar district. A major part of his support base is in his village and the adjoining villages of the area.

Sukhdev Singh of Chicha village in Amritsar district told me that the talk of Amritpal



Singh is such that he will get support of some members of the Sikh community.

The people of Punjab are very angry with Punjab Police for not stopping the drugs trade. In fact, people believe that Punjab Police is party to the drug trade.

Most of the rural folks gave me the feedback that they are supporting Amritpal because he is able to distance their children from drugs. Men and women alike say that family after family in rural Punjab has been destroyed by drugs.

People visit Jallupur Khaira from distant parts of Punjab to get their drug-addicted or alcoholic family members admitted at the rehab centre started by Waris Punjab De chief Amritpal Singh near his home here.

Amritpal Following ISI's Hit Formula For Jamaat E Islami In Kashmir

am feeling alarmed to see the growing popularity of Sikh separatist Amritpal Singh in Punjab. This is an old ISI formula. ISI funded Jamaat e Islami to initiate scores of welfare activities in Kashmir. JEI constructed so many masjids, JEI opened so many schools in the name of serving people. JEI workforce helped the people in times of any disaster.

Through these welfare initiatives, JEI was able to build a strong support base among the people. But the underlying purpose of JEI- Hurriyat was always indoctrination and radicalization.

ISI is using the same formula again in Punjab with Amritpal Singh. The state government and the police force have failed to curb the drug menace. The police is seen as a major stakeholder in the drug trade.

Due to the failure of the state machinery, the commoners are suffering. Their children are falling prey to drugs. A Sikh separatist is giving succor to the people in the name of protecting their children from drugs. His utterances have proved that his motives are not good.

Amritpal is using his sewa for drug-addicts to build a support base among the people. Using de-addiction as frontal work, Amritpal is building an army of local supporters who will stand and even fight to defend him. The inability of the state government to control the drug menace and organize successful de-addiction initiatives has given space to Amritpal to build his clout as a local leader.

in the last 10-15 years due to consumption of nasha. "There are people in our village who have everything - land, wealth. Still they sold their land and sent their children abroad for employment. They want to save the life of their children because they know that here, sooner or later the children will become drug addicts," another Sikh gentleman told me. "These are the blessings of the Akalis and the Congress. Punjab Police is well-involved in this trade. It was the same before, it is the same now," he added.

The commoners say that there are thousands of fake FIRs in different police stations against innocent youth who were targeted by the government for involvement in the drug trade, but Punjab Police is not held accountable. "Now this man came to save our youth and we are with him," said a gentleman.

Section of Punjab Youth Radicalized

During the course of the conversation, people of this area told me that from 1984 to 1990, many youngsters of these villages became terrorists and were killed by security forces. Despite this huge personal loss during terrorism years, I found that people are again supporting Amritpal.

This means that there is radicalization among the youth of the area. They are angry with the system. This has become a fertile support base for Amritpal Singh.

W Has A Very Major Role To Play In Damage Control

 SI has very deep roots in the Gulf and in Western nations for anti-India activities.

Hence Research and Analysis Wing (RAW) has a very major role to play here. There is large Sikh Diaspora in the Gulf countries for business or jobs. 1984, Amritsar, Punjab Excerpt From Write-Up By KPS Gill, Former Punjab DGP, Titled 'Endgame In Punjab: 1988-1993'

A single incident epitomises the impotence of Punjab Police at that time. On February 14, 1984, a group of militants attacked a police post at some distance from the entrance of the [Golden] Temple. Six policemen, fully armed, were 'captured' and dragged inside. The 'police response' came twenty four hours later in the form of a senior police officer who went to Bhindranwale in the Akal Takht and begged him to release his men and return their weapons.

Bhindranwale agreed only to hand over the corpse of one of the policemen who had been killed. He later relented and released the remaining five men who were still alive. Their weapons, including three sten guns, and a wireless set, were not returned. No one asked for them. No action was ever taken in the case of the murdered policeman.

I cannot imagine any police force in the world reacting to such an outrage with such utter cravenness, in such complete and impotent prostration.


2023, Ajnala, Punjab

Hundreds of supporters of Sikh separatist Amritpal Singh, including several carrying swords and guns, clashed with police and stormed the Ajnala police station near Amritsar. They camped there until police "assured" Amritpal and his supporters that his associate Lovepreet Singh Tufan, arrested on charges that included kidnapping, would be released.

Amritpal Singh warned of more protests and threatened bloodshed in Ajnala, and said that "the real violence is yet to be seen". Speaking about it later, Amritpal Singh said that the incident was "not violent enough".



AJNALA ATTACK ON POLICE STATION



Senior Cop Says It Was 'Technical Retreat, Police Underestimated Mob Strength'

"The Ajnala police station episode was unfortunate, but should not be seen as a capitulation or abdication of duty by the Punjab police... it was a technical retreat... it can be said there was some intelligence failure about the 'cowardly' act of protestors using Sri Guru Granth Sahib as a shield... and probably they underestimated the strength of the mob."

FACT CHECK

The mobike rally of Amritpal Singh and his supporters brandishing swords rode a 60-km distance. For several weeks before attack at Ajnala Police Station, Amritpal Singh had been on the radar of the police and the intelligence agencies for his divisive speeches. It was also known in security circles that Amritpal Singh has been planted by ISI to deepen the communal faultlines



in Punjab and revive the talk of Khalistan.

Amritpal Singh and his supporters stormed the Ajnala police station on February 24 carrying lathis, swords and guns. They took control over the police station for several hours, but no action was initiated against the rioters then or later.

In Jan, Punjab DGP Red-Flagged Amritpal Rise

On January 22, PM Mr Narendra Modi and Home Minister Mr Amit Shah joined the deliberations at the all-India annual conference of DGs and IGs in New Delhi. During the conference, Punjab Director General of Police Mr Gaurav Yadav made a presentation on 'Khalistan Extremism – Communication and Logistics Networks in Punjab'.

According to a report in the Indian Express, the following was highlighted for Punjab during the conference: "The ground situation in Punjab, pregnant with unease among youth due to the drugs menace and unemployment, and an apparent breakdown of administrative machinery in several districts, could have been exploited by any such radical element."

An officer who was present at the conference told the media that Amritpal's posing a challenge to the police would not have worked if there was clear political direction. In this way, the senior officer indicated upon the lack of communication between the Punjab Police and the state political leadership.

Sikh Separatist Using Oldest Tactic In Book: Serving The Needy

Sikh separatist Amritpal Singh is employing a time-tested strategy to get into the collective mind-space in Punjab. The deepest pain of the people in the state is drug addiction, which has acquired monstrous proportions. Amritpal Singh has opened a rehabilitation centre in his native village Jallupur Khaira village in Amritsar district. Sewadars (voluntary workers) at the centre say that drug addicts are given free treatment which includes ayurvedic medicines, yoga, good diet and shabad-kirtan (Gurbani recital).

If all is sewa and service here, where is there tension in the village over talk of Khalistan? A report in The Indian Express on February 27 noted that while there is clear personal support for Amritpal for his deaddiction work, there is also a sense of disquiet about his demands for Khalistan.

DREADED TERRORIST ZAKIR MUSA WAS LINKED TO

n November 2018, one of Kashmir's most deadly terrorists Zakir Musa was connected to the deadly grenade attack on Nirankari Bhawan in Amritsar's Rajasansi village in which three people were killed and 20 injured. Musa was

the commander of Al-Qaeda in Kashmir and the chief of Kashmir-based Ansar Ghazwatul-Hind, an Al-Qaeda cell.

Security agencies learnt that two men who were accused of the terror attack were fresh recruits of Zakir Musa. The accused used HG 84 grenades, which are similar to the ones manufactured by the Pakistani Army Ordinance factory.

In November and December 2018, Zakir Musa was spotted in Amritsar by the security agencies. His photographs appeared in the mainstream media, in which he was seen wearing a turban, following which a high alert was sounded across the state. I remember seeing a photograph of Musa on social media in Kashmir in which he had pinned a Khalsa symbol in his turban.

Musa carried a bounty of Rs 1 million Indian rupees on his head announced by GOI in 2017. Intelligence agencies said that Musa was planning to replicate J&K-style attacks in Punjab. He was in Punjab with a group of five or six Jaish-e-Mohammed terrorists.

Bond Between Khalistan, Kashmir Terror Networks

How did a terrorist of the stature of Zakir Musa manage to stay in Amritsar for two months? Who gave him food, shelter, accommodation? It is understood that he went there to connect with the Khalistan networks, supported by ISI.

National Investigation Agency (NIA) learnt that Khalistani terrorists, Al-Qaeda cell and Pakistan's ISI were suspected to be behind the attacks. Musa was killed by the security forces in Kashmir in May 2019.

At that time, we read that the entire security establishment was on high alert over the security threat from Jaish terrorists in Punjab. Intelligence agencies know that ISI is always on the job to widen the arc of terrorism by creating a pipeline between Kashmir militancy and Khalistan radicals. Investigations have revealed over years that

sleeper cells are set up in Punjab under the supervision of ISI, Kashmir and Khalistan radicals to gather arms and ammunition.

Now we are seeing Sikh separatism getting momentum in Punjab with the rise of Amritpal Singh.

Amritpal Talk Same As Radicalization Talk In Kashmir

ISI is constantly active on its project to destabilize India.
On January 24, Baramulla
Police prevented five youth including two boys from joining militancy. ISI stays active to build connections with Kashmiri boys who are radicalized and involve them in the terror networks.
Already these boys have a fertile mind to get into terror tracks.

Amritpal is doing the same talk that is drilled into the heads of vulnerable Kashmiri boys. These boys are poorly educated. They lack employment, they lack financial resources. It is very easy for any terror handler to induct the radicalized youth into such activities.

How is it that Amritpal is firing salvo after salvo? In speech after speech, he is mocking and challenging the government. He says he is ready for dialogue, he is ready for fight. All these arrows being shot by Amritpal have come with ISI coaching.

The unfortunate part is that when the religion card is played, people go mad. They cannot make out the difference between right and wrong. They cannot distinguish who is using them and how they are being used. They think that what they are doing is azeem kaam, it is a huge service to religion. They think that they are doing it voluntarily.

Even now, our youngsters who join terror ranks feel that they are doing a great service to the religion. Shariyat ya shahadat was the common theme of Zakir Musa. I can see the same pattern emerging with Amritpal Singh.

If the government takes it lightly, it will become a big problem for both states. This shall have repercussions elsewhere too. If Khalistan activity heats up, communal lines between Sikhs and Hindus will deepen. This is exactly what ISI wants – to flare up communal fires in India.

This chingari cannot be allowed to take the shape of a fire. The government must not display any weak points. If action had been initiated against Amritpal Singh at Ajnala, it would have kept things relatively simple compared to what the situation is now.

Now, with so much freedom and media coverage, Amritpal's stature and clout have gone up in the eyes of the youth. He talks of the twin themes of religious supremacy and religious victimization. He is able to influence young blood. He is being fed from the same source that fed Kashmir terrorism. The government needs to be very careful and must initiate prompt action against him.

is show of strength at Ajnala shocked the country. How did so many youths join him? There were hundreds

of men with Amritpal at Ajnala, and he said that only 10 per cent have come with me. He is not making youth join him by doling out money. There is deep planning which has gone into mobilizing the high numbers of these youth.

It is pointless to assume that Amritpal is going to radicalize these youths. These youths are already radicalized by ISI's Khalistan networks. Many more Khalistanis are waiting in the wings, watching for their turn to come when they will also join the drama that is unfolding.

Amritpal is giving huge statements, divisive speeches, getting huge gatherings and media coverage. It is not possible that he will be unarmed. The men who accompanied him to storm the Ajnala police station were carrying guns and swords. In all likelihood, the Khalistanis have armed sleeper cells in Punjab which are hidden as of now.

Amritpal knows that with the speeches that he is making, the government will initiate action against him today or tomorrow. Already his associates have weapons.

A problem that I observe in Punjab is that the alertness level is not high as it is in Kashmir. The ammunition received by Khalistan networks there can be easily sent to Kashmir.
